Pseudobrutal

Brutalist architecture is a movement that flourished from the 1950s to the mid-1970s, descending from the modernist architectural movement of the early 20th century. The term originates from the French word for "raw" in the term used by Le Corbusier to describe his choice of material béton brut (raw concrete) (from https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Brutalist_architecture).

Brutalist web design, similarly, is marked by a no-frills design philosophy, with function determining form. See <http://brutalistwebdesign.com/> for examples and <https://news.ycombinator.com/item?id=11517491>, <https://codepen.io/brlanhaferkamp/posts/feed/>, etc. for discussion.

Brutalism now arrives for Tiki Wiki CMS Groupware in the form of the Pseudobrutal theme, "pseudobrutal" because, of course, underlying the spare appearance is the full Tiki foundation including the Bootstrap CSS framework, jQuery, kitchen sink As the discussions show, there's no real consensus on what web Brutalism is; this theme is perhaps one approach. Feel free to push it further with your idea of a raw presentation of information via theme customization.

Installation

When the theme archive is expanded, its files will be in a directory (folder) that contains all the theme files in their necessary subdirectories. Install the theme by transferring this directory to the Tiki site's "themes" directory. After refreshing the site's Look and Feel admin page, the theme name will appear in the theme selector, and can be selected.

Fonts

This theme uses a webfont that is retrieved from Google Fonts. If the Tiki site doesn't have access to the Internet, or if there is some reason it shouldn't make the request for the font, then local storage of the font should be implemented.

Theme modification

The style sheet of this Tiki theme is compiled from Less files. For a particular site, the theme can be modified by editing the relevant Less partial and compiling the CSS. Or the CSS style sheet itself can be edited. Alternatively, a custom.css file in the themes directory will override any rules in the style sheet, or CSS rules can be input in the Custom CSS text area under the Customization tab of the Look and Feel admin page of the site's control panels. Metro Vibes is the latest of the free PixelKit themes to be adapted for Tiki Wiki CMS Groupware.

This theme features a fluidly adaptive page background and translucent content background. Not all of the page elements in the PixelKit package have been implemented in this adaptation, but Tiki's pages, dialog boxes, popups, and so on are fairly thoroughly styled.

Like all the themes offered by Zukathemes, Metro Vibes works with any of the layouts - standard page or fixed top navbar, and so on.

What files are included

This theme includes all the files of the original PixelKit free package, but not all of these are necessarily used in this Tiki implementation of the theme. If you are familiar with the Less CSS pre-processor, you can check the contents of the less directory in this package to find what files are used in the compiling of the final CSS style sheet.

What the theme covers

The Tiki implementation of this theme includes color palette and typographical treatment and the most commonly used elements in the original PixelKit page elements such as navbars and buttons, but not all objects. Sliders, rotary dials and ribbons, etc. aren't yet implemented. These may be, in the future, or could be provided as a contract-based enhancement.

Installation

Fonts

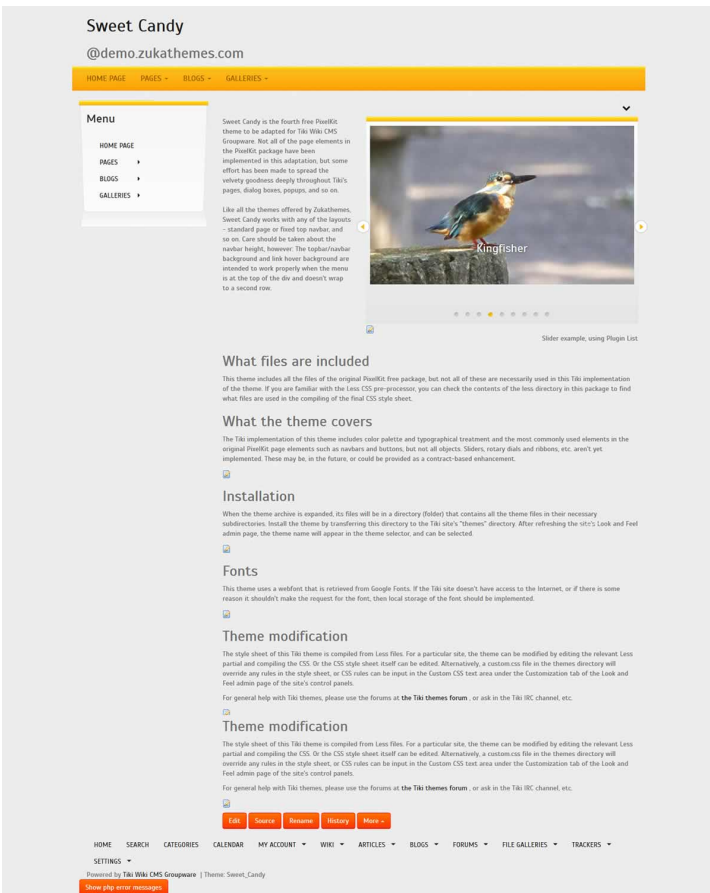

TUFTEN IS A THEME for Tiki Wiki CMS Groupware based on [Tuffe CSS](#). This page contains edited content from the original Tuffe CSS project documentation but is amended where Tiki's implementation differs or extends.

Tuffe CSS provides tools to style web articles using the ideas demonstrated by [Edward Tufte's](#) books and handouts. Tuffe's style is known for its simplicity, extensive use of sidenotes, tight integration of graphics with text, and carefully chosen typography.

The idea of the original Tuffe CSS was essentially cribbed wholesale from Tuffe-LaTeX and R Markdown's Tuffe Handout format.¹

Now, integrating the Bootstrap CSS framework, the Tuffe style has been worked up as the Tuften theme for Tiki Wiki CMS Groupware, with typography and other details implemented by means of appropriate rules and properties in CSS. As for the "sidenotes", Tiki already has a [Footnote](#) "wiki plugin", so this was adapted to enable the Tuffe sidenotes and margin notes and yet remain functional for the conventional page-bottom footnotes used by Tiki's visual themes other than Tuften. Notice that [Tiki](#) and [Bootstrap Sample Elements](#) isn't categorized "Sidenotes" so the footnotes aren't rendered as sidenotes.

Fundamentals

Use `section` tags around each logical grouping of text and headings. In Tiki's wiki syntax, an HTML section can be created with the `HTML` plugin or `Tag` plugin.

Headings

Tuffe CSS uses `h1` for the document title, `h2` for section headings, and `h3` for low-level headings. More specific headings are provided for in Tiki by the underlying Bootstrap framework, but unsupported by Tuffe CSS (or the Tuften theme). If you feel the urge to reach for a heading level 4, 5, or 6, consider redesigning your document (in

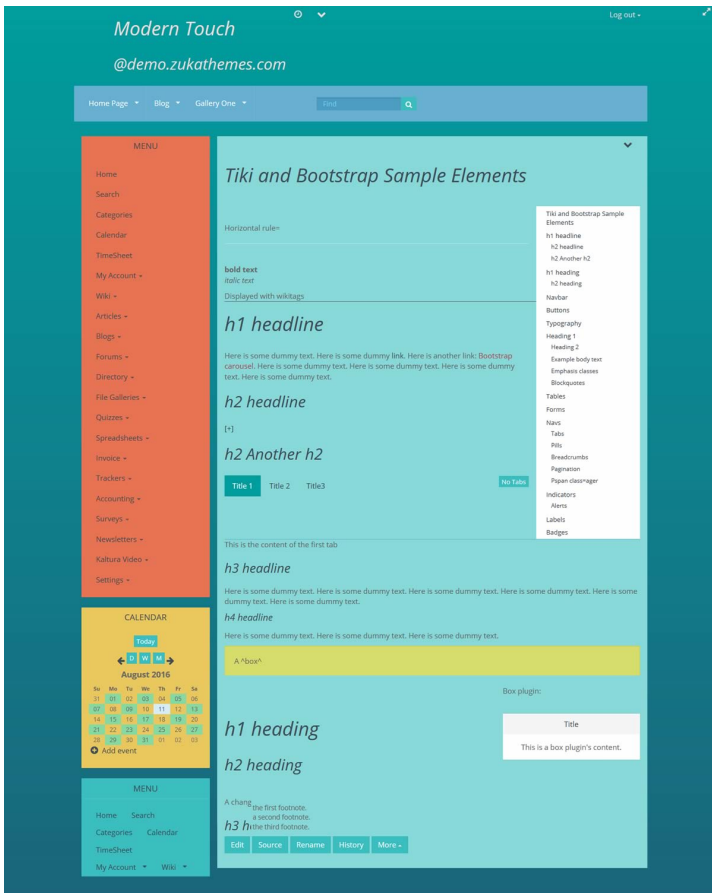

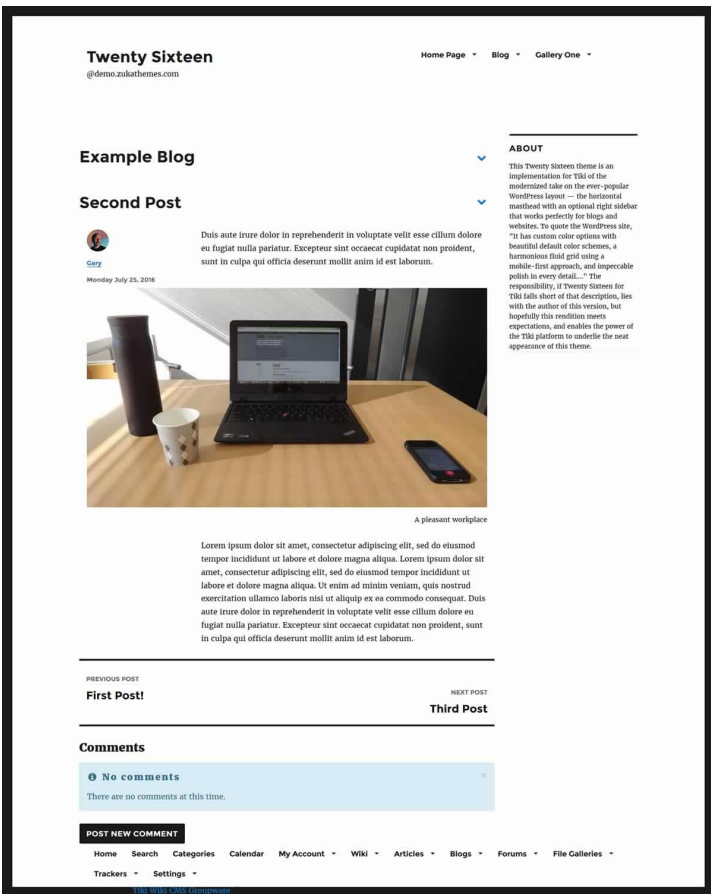

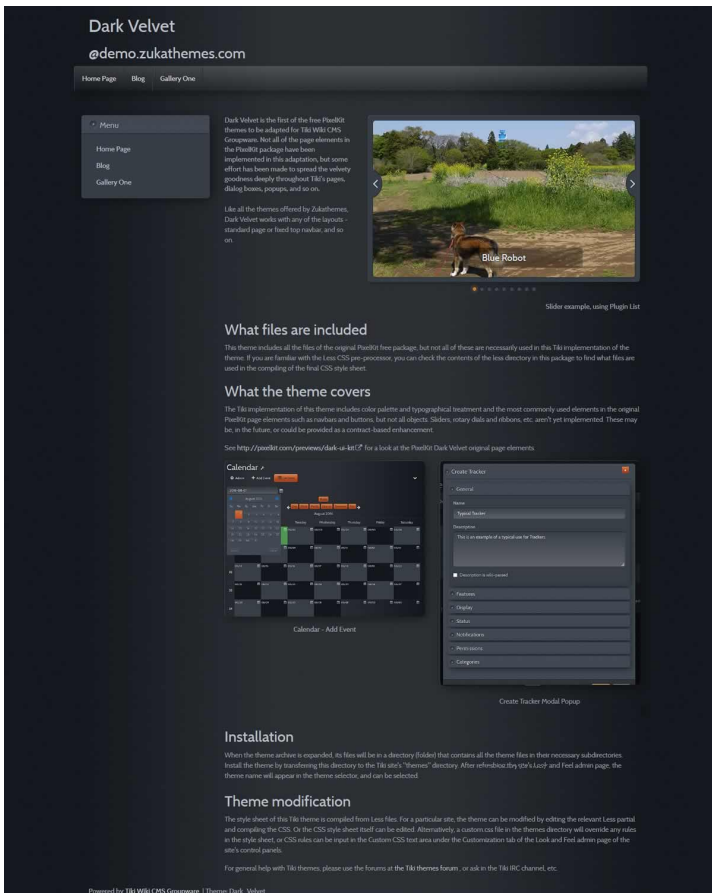
